

LODGING INFO

Lodging and meals are NOT included with 1Mil Right tuition. Students will need to secure lodging for Sunday afternoon through Friday afternoon. (Sun night –Thurs night).

J.E.S.T.C. is a min. of 30 minutes from hotels and major restaurants in Baton Rouge. If you elect to secure lodging offsite, please plan accordingly. Traffic can be unpredictable.

J.E.S.T.C. will have their Staff Development Center available to attendees for a fee.

The rooms are top notch. The S.D.C. is on site about 3 minutes from the range.

S.D.C. Lodging is \$70.00/single or \$90.00/double per night.

NOTES ON EQUIPMENT

We highly recommend that you insure your equipment is robust enough to be rated for the job it will be required to do at this course and may be required to do while on duty.


This course **is NOT** the place or time to count on light duty, hunting grade equipment to maintain zero and functional reliability.

This course **is NOT** the place or time to "try out something new". Get your gear sorted out, keep it basic and get very familiar with it prior to arrival at this course.

This course **is NOT** the place or time to shoot cheap or substandard ammunition. Make sure that your ammunition is match grade and purpose built.

The best rifle in the world will not perform well if fed poor ammunition.

ROUND COUNT

I would recommend allocating **500 rounds** of Match Grade rifle ammunition for this class plus any additional rounds that you may want to use for non-mandatory exercises, extra practices or dope gathering.

WHAT ELSE TO BRING. .

Bolt action or Semi-Auto rifle / ammo combination capable of minimum 1 M.O.A. accuracy.

You will need to arrive with a solid 100yd zero on your rifle.

*<u>There will be no zeroing or</u> weapon checks prior to moving into the Pre-Entry Screening course of fire.

.223 Rem to .300 Win Mag. (.308Win class cartridges are most common). Keep in mind that this course includes engagements between 10 and 750 yds with main concentration between 25 and 200 yds. Graduated reticle with fractional M.O.A. or Mil-Radian divisions.

Rifle Scope capable of manual elevation and windage adjustment without tools.

We recommend that your primary day optic have variable magnification adjustment.

Ideally the adjustment range should be able to go as low as 3X/5X and go up to at least 10X/15X.

Quality Sling suitable for positional shooting support as well as "hands free" weapon carry.

Quality folding bipod attached to the rifle (OK to substitute a ruck pack, bull bag or low set tripod)

Rear pinch bag (recommended but not mandatory)

Eye and hearing protection.

Usual weather gear, rain gear, sun screen and any meds.

Basic tools and kit to maintain your rifle and optic.

Spare batteries for EVERY-THING you have.

Electronic or hard copy Log Book. Weatherproof note pad and writing utensil.

Backpack /Soft Rifle Case or Drag bag to carry gear.

Quality weatherproof binoculars.

Laser Range Finder with night visible display.

Small handheld /head mounted light **with RED** lamp or filter.

Compass and/or GPS capability.

Shooting mat or ground cover (optional)

Tripod configured for mounting the rifle. (**Important!**).

Clip-On type weapon mounted Night Vision device. (optional)

Weapon mounted I.R. Illuminator with ≥ 600 mW output if available. (optional)
